| PSD School Board Report | Presenter Eric Cameron

- COVID Update: We had a smooth first week back after the required one week online after Christmas break. There are 1100 continuing online (both the full year online and those choosing option 2) which is 100 more than before Christmas break. COVID costs are projected to be \$7.6 million. Even with the federal government \$4 million commitment and limited COVID supplies from the provincial government, we will have a deficit in this portion of our budget for this school year. Extra costs include additional salaries and benefits related to offering both the online and in-class programs; time spent on contact tracing, extra COVID supplies.
- Board directed Administration to establish a deadline for schools to nominate a first-year teacher for the Alberta School Boards Association's Edwin Parr Award as February 19. This award recognizes a teacher who exemplifies the criteria laid out for outstanding teachers in their first full year of teaching. Trustees Montgomery and Cameron will be the Trustee representatives on the selection committee.
- The Board directed Administration to conduct an attendance area review of all schools in Parkland School Division in order to facilitate long term planning and the effective use of our school facilities. This report will be presented to the Board in the fall of 2021. This is a timely review for Spruce Grove and Stony Plain with the completion of Woodhaven modernization in Spruce Grove and the new K-9 school to be built in Stony Plain. The modernization and expansion of Spruce Grove Composite High School is our number one capital priority and is the hands of our provincial government at this time.
- The Board reviewed the Quarterly Financial Report for the period ending Nov. 30, 2020. A
 balanced budget is forecast for the year ending Aug. 31, 2021 even with the extra costs of
 COVID prevention measures and materials.
- The Board received as information the Alternate Education Programs Assurance Report. The Choice in Education Act affirms that parents have the right to choose the kind of education they feel will be best for their children. Parkland School Division has a strong history of offering a variety of choices for educational programs and continues to do so with the recent implementation of a variety of new programs.

- The Board received as information the Wellness Assurance Report which outlined initiatives focused on working collectively with staff, caregivers and community to provide programming support and services aimed at fostering wellness in children, youth and families: create healthy responsive and innovative learning environments that are rich with the evidence-based norms for healthy communities (daily physical activities, physical literacy, food security and nutrition, environmental education, active transportation and creation of positive social environments).
- Trustees met virtually with MLA's Turton and Getson to engage in discussion on a variety of topics (these are regular scheduled meetings to keep abreast of the latest government initiatives and bringing MLA's up to speed on what is going on in PSD).

- --ASCA—group of parents that represent school councils and COSC at government level, bringing forward concerns from divisions
- --government cut funding for ASCA halfway through 2nd quarter by 75%
 - --re-alignment of paid positions within the organization, while keeping as many as possible
 - --board of directors is down to 8 people (normally 12)
- --AGM in April with elections taking place then
 - --will still be online, but trying to make it seem like an in-person event
 - --working with vendors that have normally attended with making information videos
- --planning to revise fee schedule—will be a slight increase in upcoming year (not drastic, but is reasonable for work that is required)
- --started vetting resolutions that have been received (about 12 currently)
 - --if wanting to put forward a resolution, deadline is coming up
- --encourage all to take part in conference (check website for information about registration and resolutions)
