
Here we are, March already! Although it seems a little early in the second semester and students are busily working on meeting the goals and needs of their current courses, March is the time when planning for the next school year truly begins. In order to enable your student to select courses for the 2020-21 school year, parents, you must ensure you have completed the online registration/ verification process for your student. The deadline to complete this step is March 20th. If you have not yet done so, please go to Parkland School Division's website, click on 'Registration' and follow the directions outlined.

Students will be attending a grade level course selection assembly this month. At this assembly, grade coordinators and courselors will provide a brief presentation that will help guide student expectations, planning and course selection procedures for the next school year. Student course selection will begin on April 14th, following Easter Long Weekend.

Between now and mid-April, we strongly encourage your student to begin their individual planning process by consulting with current teachers and counselors and researching potential postsecondary programs to find out about required courses and competitive averages required for admission. Perhaps your student needs to start with an online interest or skills inventory which can help guide their exploration. To assist, we recommend your stu-**MvBlueprint** dent make use of their account at www.myBlueprint.ca. This is an invaluable tool introduced to students through their CALM course in grade 10. The program assists with exploration of post-secondary programs, careers and with tracking of high school credits and diploma completion. Additionally, please make sure your student has signed up for a my-Pass account, which is your direct, secure access to your Alberta Education information. This account is required for viewing diploma exam marks, tracking high school credits, ordering transcripts, etc.

Although it is always an exciting time to begin thinking about new goals and planning to achieve them, your student should not forget that the first step towards meeting next year's goals is to ensure their attention, diligence and overall hard work is applied in a way which fulfills current goals.
