As you read through this newsletter, you will find out more about Seminar and TCT, as well, as DLR and our attendance pyramid, and how we use all these items to better our student learning experience.



<u>SEMINAR</u>: Self-directed learning time that occurs Monday-Thursday from 2:30 pm – 3:07 pm. Students have access to their teachers for one-on-one or small group support. It is expected that students are in attendance at this time. The school day ends at 3:07 pm.

TCT (Teacher Collaborative Time): Eight times throughout the year, classes will not start until 10:06 am. This provides the opportunity for staff to meet and discuss their practice and address issues concerning the learning of their students. For bus students who cannot arrange a ride, there are large areas for them to work in until classes begin at 10:06 am.

**DLR (Directed Learning Room)**: The Directed Learning Room is supervised by Administration from 3:15 pm until 5:00 pm on Tuesday through Thursday. Students can be assigned to DLR by their teachers and/or Grade Coordinator for a variety of things including missed assignments or exams, skipping class, etc.

SGCHS has in place a variety of processes for supporting student success, attendance and expectations. Students who are not responding to encouragement and support for improvements will be required to develop a personal success plan which may include: utilizing DLR, studying at home or attending our Academic Achievement Centre (InReach) or OutReach. Other appropriate programs are also available which will lead to student success. For more information, check out our Student Handbook on the website.

Parent Input Needed for SGCHS ED PLAN

2022-2023 sees us enter year three of a three year Ed Plan.

The primary focus of the plan has been STUDENT SUCCESS.

In our first year of this three year plan, we asked parents what they believed are

characteristics which make an individual successful in our society. We also asked what characteristics you thought we helped to build here at the school and which you thought we needed to focus on more. We asked you to rate us on how you thought we were doing with this.

Using data we gathered from parents, staff, students and the community as a whole, we determined the characteristics of success requiring our focus are: Problem Solving, Critical Thinking, Collaboration and Communication. When individuals are able to do these four things well, they will achieve success. This is what we all want for our students

Over the course of our three year Education Plan, our staff has been doing professional development work on how to incorporate these four characteristics of success. The first year, primarily, we developed a common Problem Solving plan; we standardized common language for when we break tasks down and model how to use the strategies to solve problems in all subject areas. We began to explore the 3Cs (Critical Thinking, Collaboration and Communication). Last year, we continued to develop lessons and best practices for these Characteristics of Success in all classes so that students could begin to utilize them as they saw them modelled across all curricula.

This year will see staff continuing to model effective Problem Solving, Critical Thinking, Collaboration and Communication while assisting our students to internalize these same characteristics to achieve success.

We need your input to help set our priorities for the year. Since some of you have been with us as we have worked through this plan, there are slightly different questions we have for you. If your student is in Grade 10 or is new to our building this year, please complete the <a href="New or Grade 10 Parent Survey">New or Grade 10 Parent Survey</a>. If your student was with us last year, please complete the Grade 11/12 Parent Survey.



# **COVID-aware Message**

SGCHS and Parkland School Division are excited that the World is Opening Back Up. 2022-2023 should finally start to feel like what a school year is supposed to feel like. While the pandemic is officially over, our new reality is that COVID-19 is here to stay.

With that being said, there are many measures that were previously implemented that just make sense to continue. Above all, we encourage anyone who is feeling ill to stay home from school. If you are exhibiting any of the key symptoms known for COVID-19, we encourage you to access one of the many test kits that are also available at the school. Meanwhile, PSD will continue the following:

- Hand sanitizer will still be readily available at all schools,
- Students will continue to be reminded of the importance of thorough hand-washing hygiene,
- School staff will ensure that appropriate cleaning of high touch areas will continue,
- The frequency at which air filters are changed in PSD has also been increased and air handling/ventilation equipment in all schools has been adjusted to maximize the number of air exchanges within the schools. All schools will operate filtration systems that meet or exceed the Minimum Efficiency Reporting Values (MERV) 13 air filtration rate, and
- Where practical, entrances and exits can be used to efficiently reduce crowding during high traffic times of the day.
