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Greetings, Students and Parents/Guardians.

Although the signs of Spring are waffling, March is here. February proved to be a bustling month with the onset of our second semester, Teachers' Convention, Family Day, and Pink Shirt Day. Academically, students are actively working towards the goals of their current Semester 2 courses. March marks the initial stages for the next school year. To ensure your student is enrolled at SGCHS for the 2024-25 school year and is prepared for course selection, parents must complete Parkland School Division's <u>Online Registration</u> by the divisional deadline of March 22nd by 4:30 p.m.

Online student course selection will begin once we return from Spring Break. Grade 10 and 11 students will attend grade level course selection assemblies at the beginning of April. These sessions, led by grade coordinators and counselors, will guide students in understanding expectations, planning, and course selection procedures for the upcoming school year.

We strongly encourage students to initiate their

planning process by consulting with their current teachers and grade level counselors, researching potential post-secondary programs, and signing up for a <u>myPass</u> account for secure access to Alberta Education information, including diploma exam marks, high school credits, and transcripts.

As the school year concludes and summer plans take shape, please note that our Semester 2 Exams start on June 13 and run through June 27. Student attendance on exam days is crucial, as these exams contribute significantly to their final demonstrated achievement. The exact schedule will be available shortly. Please plan any vacations to start after June 27, 2024.

Registration Reminder

Visit <u>https://powerschool.psd.ca/public/</u> and log into your parent account. Once inside the Parent Portal:

- Select your child's name in the blue bar at the top of the screen.
- Select the RSVP icon on the left side of the screen.
- Begin reviewing all of your current Student Information we have on file, and allow the instructions on the screen to navigate through the various tabs in the form (Student Info, Address, Contacts, Medical, etc.)
