SGCHS Theatre Arts represented our school at the Zone 2 West Drama Festival. Both One Act plays received glowing adjudications that praised their professionalism and artistry. They were awarded the following honors: **The Serpent** won Outstanding Production, \$500.00 and was chosen to represent the Zone at the Provincial Drama Festival in Red Deer; **Family By Numbers** won Outstanding Ensemble; one member won Outstanding Achievement in Stage and Technical Management for both productions; and one member was recognized with an Honourable Mention for their work as Movement Director of **The Serpent**. Continuing with The Arts, Drumline students travelled to Calgary to compete in the Canadian Drumline Association Provincial Festival. They moved up to the Intermediate class this year and received first place (gold) for their field show. Concert Band went to Sun Peaks, BC to participate in the ConBrio Music Festival the last weekend of the month bringing home Gold! Rounding this all out was the PSD Art Show hosted at MCHS. Our student’s artwork shone! Just around the corner is the Spruce Grove Arts Council Show at the Public Library. We are fortunate enough to have students whose work will be a part of this fabulous presentation, as well.

In addition, some of our CTS program students showcased their talents at the Zone Skills Canada Competition. One Grade 10 student came in 4th in the hairstyling junior braiding competition. A Gr 12 student won 1st in Bridal Hairstyling intermediate. Both students will be moving onto the provincial competition later this month.

In sports, our Badminton Singles Zone Champ is heading to Provincials. Rugby, soccer and track are gaining traction as I write this. Looks like good seasons all around.

On April 24, we had a Career Fair in our Small Gym. All Grade 11s and 12s had a chance to go through to check out a large variety of booths including: Bricklayers Association, Alberta First Responders, NAIT, Coventry Homes, Border Paving, Certified Professional Accountants, Service Canada, Alberta Vet Tech Associations, NCSG Crane & Heavy Haul, Careers NextGen, Acheson Business Association, Magna IV Engineering, Universal Rail Systems, and AH Steel. This event also saw our PSD Trustees and Senior Executive come check out the action at our school.

Our International Travelers to Germany and Japan are back. The students had great learning experiences and enjoyed the opportunities they had to utilize their additional language as well as explore its homeland, culture and history. Next year’s trips, one to Italy and one to New York City, are in the works.

Speaking of things which come next, course selections are almost done. If your student has not yet completed this process, please have them see their Grade Coordinator or Counsellor. It is important that students select their courses for the next academic year so that we can adequately prepare the new timetable and ensure that students are enrolled in classes they need to achieve their academic goals. As well, if you have not yet completed the registration process for next year, please do so ASAP. We will be moving into the actual scheduling process soon. It is amazing how close the end of this year actually is!

On that note, it’s worth pointing out that Grad, the pinnacle of high school education is a mere six weeks away and the school year ends in nine weeks.

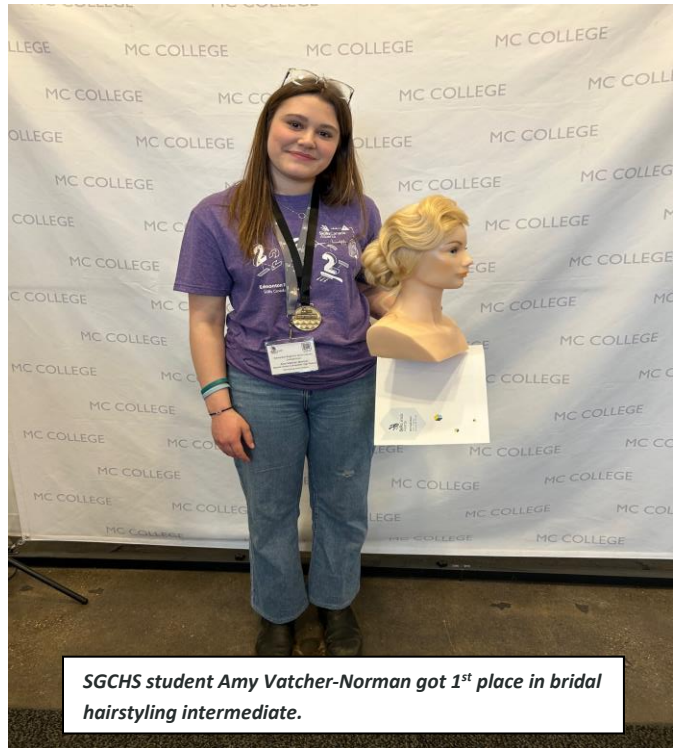

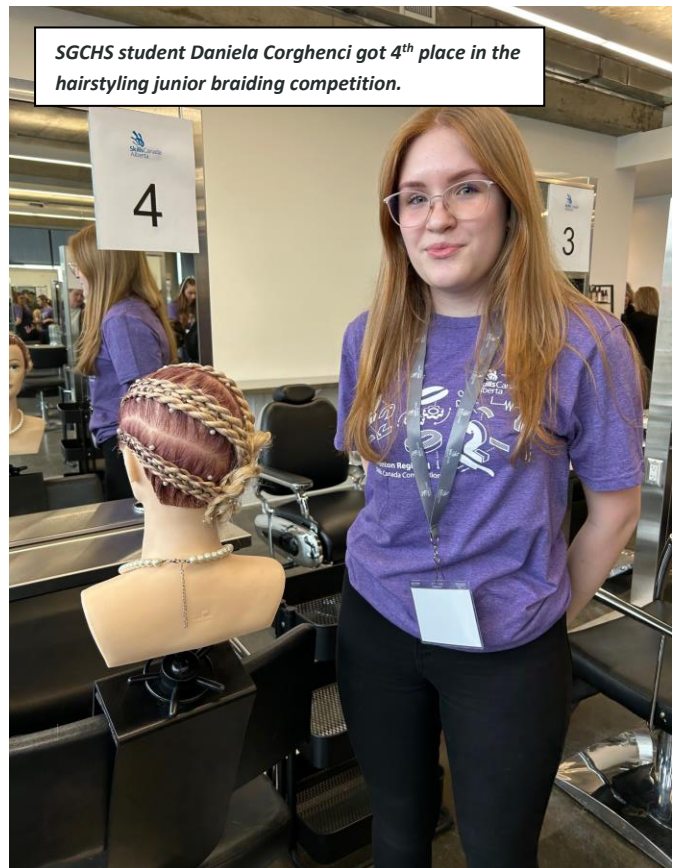
