## Build Your Foundationnendance

- Absences (excused or unexcused) impact learning
- High school courses move at a faster pace than in middle years
- It is the student's responsibility to reduce the impact of absences by engaging with their learning when absent:
  - o contact teacher via email, schedule a GMeet
  - o contact a classroom peer
  - access Google Classroom, Moodle Site or Class Website
- A 10% or greater rate of absenteeism is concerning
- 10 or more absences in a 80 day semester (12.5% absentee rate) motivates intervention:
  - Consideration of context
  - Conversation with student and parent & plan to address existing obstacles
  - Alternate programming plan, if necessary

# Build Your Foundation: Seminar, DLR & TC

**Seminar:** 40 minutes of dedicated time each day to meet with teachers, write or make-up tests, group projects, finish homework, study, make concept maps, get ahead on project work, etc.

**DLR (Directed Learning Room):** Students can be assigned to the library on Tuesdays, Wednesdays or Thursdays, from 3:15 to 5, in order to complete outstanding assignments, projects or exams.

- Admin Supervised
- Attendance is taken and calls home are made

**TCT (Teacher Collaboration Time):** Dedicated time (about once a month, from 8:30 to 10am) for teachers to meet with teachers to work on programming, instruction and any learning that will elevate students school success. Students in attendance are assigned to supervised areas and to review, study and/or work on assignments, projects or exams. DLR, in our library, is open during this time, as well.

### A Few Things to Be Aware Of: Final Exams

What: These are end of Semester final exams. Weighted differently depending on subject.

Which classes?

- Languages
- English (has 2 parts on 2 different days)
- Science
- Math
- Social Studies (has 2 parts on 2 different days)

Attendance for final exams:

Final exams must be written at the scheduled time.

Illness confirmed by a doctor's note or emergency situations will be accepted as a valid excuse for not writing an exam.

Conflict forms must be submitted for students who have conflicting exams. Students whose request are approved will be scheduled to write final exams during the exam conflict day. <u>An early holiday is not</u> <u>considered school excused.</u>

### A Few Things to Be Aware Of: Work Experience 15/

- ightarrow Earn 1 credit per 25 hours worked (starting in your grade 10 year)
- ightarrow Earn 20 credits towards your High School Diploma
- → 10 of those credit can count towards your two other 30-level courses requirement for graduation purposes
- → Must have your HCS 3000 completed prior to enrollment in WE
- → See Mrs. Wiebe in Student Services



### A Few Things to Be Aware Of: RAP

Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP) - How do I enroll?

- Must be 16 years of age or older
- Must have a track record of success in your grade 10 year
- Make an appointment with Mr. Stuckey or Mrs. Klemp (our Off-Campus Coordinators)
- Employer or prospective employer must be willing to take you on as an Apprentice
- A program for Grade 11 and 12 students that requires up front planning.
